

### Rai Bahadur Ranada Prasad Shaha A Man Who Lived His Dream

Rai Bahadur Ranada Prasad Shaha was a true son of this soil, a man extraordinaire, whose life's work and achievements are beyond comparison. Not only did he sacrifice his life for his beloved country but his legacy - Kumudini Welfare Trust of Bengal (KWT) - stands as the highest form of philanthropy. The Trust was founded in June 1947 with the mission of providing exclusive service to the suffering humanity.

A great visionary, he was indeed concerned about the well being of the poor and specially the underprivileged women. He bequeathed all his wealth for the welfare of the less fortunate. What prompted him to undertake this initiative was his childhood experience of his mother's death and his love for humanity. R P Shaha was born in 1896 to Debendra Kumar and Srimati Kumudini. He was only seven years old when his mother died a painful death from tetanus infection.

The death of his mother left a profound impact on the young mind of R P Shaha. He made a promise that if his fate permitted, he would do something for the ailing mothers and women. After his mother's death, his father remarried leaving him restless and yearning for motherly care and attention. In this situation he was sent to Kishoreganj to stay with his maternal uncle. He spent his adolescence there, where his formal education could not go beyond the first few years in elementary school. Young R P Shaha ran away from home and began a new life in Calcutta selling newspapers at Howrah Railway Station and working as a canteen boy. He also joined the Swadeshi Movement against the British occupation and that landed him in jail for some time.

When the First World War broke out, he enlisted in the Bengal Ambulance Corps of the British Indian Army as a soldier and was sent to Mesopotamia in present day Iraq. There he performed his duties with distinction earning a medal and citation from King George the Fifth. He also received a gallantry award for saving some British officers from fire in their camps. Later on he was awarded the Viceroy's Commission.

Returning to Calcutta he took up trading in coal, starting with door - to- door coal supply and gradually progressed to large supply orders. Thus a wealthy Ranada Prasad Shaha was born through sheer hard work and perseverance. In 1933 he became a share holder in a joint river transportation business named "Bengal River Service". Later on he bought the firm. This was the core business of all commercial ventures. By 1945, R P Shaha had already acquired the entire jute business of the Scottish firm George Henderson & Company at Narayanganj which was previously owned by an English firm named David & Company.



In 1938, R P Shaha set up a dispensary with outdoor facilities at his village home. It was named after his grandmother Srimati Shova Sundari. On July 27, 1944 the then Governor of Bengal, Lord Richard G Casey inaugurated a 750 bed hospital in Mirzapur. This free hospital was named Kumudini Hospital. R P Shaha strongly believed that the foremost requirement to achieve women's freedom and establish their rights was healthcare and education. He established an impressive institution Bharateswari Homes for girls at Mirzapur. He also founded Kumudini Girls College at Tangail and Debendra College at Manikganj.

In July 1944 he donated an amount of Rs. 2,50,000/ - to the British Red Cross Appeal Fund. In the early fifties he financed construction of the Maternity Ward of Combined Military Hospital (CMH) in Dhaka. This great philanthropist was abducted along with his younger son Bhabani Prasad Shaha by the Pakistan Army and their collaborators on May 7, 1971 during the Liberation War. They never returned. His spirit lives among his successors who are on the Board of Directors of the Trust. R P Shaha was the first Managing Director succeeded by his daughter Joya Pati. His grandson Rajiv Prasad Shaha is the present Managing Director of the Trust and the tradition goes on. Huseyn Shaheed Suhrawardy, the former Prime Minister of Pakistan on a visit to Kumudini Complex at Mirzapur in the mid fifties wrote in the visitor's book: "A poor man become a millionaire, and the millionaire voluntarily become a poor man, spending his all in the service of humanity, for the suffering and the distressed, for the furtherance of education, for rendering a service to the State, which the state itself has not undertaken. But is the Rai Bahadur poor; he is rich in the esteem, in the affection, in the love of a grateful people; having giving all his worldly possession, he has obtained more than those who were his compeers. May that State and the people he has served so will give him that recognition which is his due, and not destroy the great institution he has built with such love and devotion."

### **College Facilities**

Kumudini Women's Medical College is implementing a well-designed curriculum for MBBS and BDS courses approved by the Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council. It is well equipped with adequate facilities for utilizing modern and effective instructional teaching-learning methods and aids in accordance with the curriculum. The academic environment nurtures development of faculties for improving quality of education through continuous monitoring and rigorous evaluation system. Physical infrastructure within the college and its affiliated hospital provides appropriate spaces for lecture, demonstrations, tutorials, practical and bed side clinical teaching. It has well equipped laboratories, tutorial rooms for small group discussion and one spacious dissection hall with a museum, library with wide reading room, students' common room, canteen, and fair price shop.

#### The main facilities include:

- □ Lecture Halls (Four): with Multimedia Sound System, OHP, Slide Projector and Black board/White Board.
- Tutorial rooms (Sixteen): various departments share the tutorial room according to the class routine.
- □ Laboratories (Six):

- Museum (Four): Anatomy-1, Pathology-1, Community Medicine-1 and Forensic Medicine-1 which contains adequate number of specimen, charts and models.
- Continued Medical Education Unit.

## **Teaching Methods and Materials**

Theoretical lectures are delivered in the lecture halls equipped with Laptop, Multimedia with Sound System, OHP, Slide Projector and Black/White Board. Small group teaching and discussions are held in tutorial rooms in batches. Anatomy dissection and histology classes are held batch-wise in respective rooms furnished with necessary instruments, cadavers and other teaching aids. There are also arrangements for clinical classes in the inpatient and outpatient departments in the hospital.







### **Quality Assurance and Professional Development**

As per the guidelines of Government Quality Assurance Scheme (QAS) in Medical Education an Institutional Quality Assurance Body (IQAB) has been functioning.

### **Purpose and Aim of QAS**

The following bodies carryout the functions for QAS through:

#### 1. Academic Council

- ☐ The highest academic body of the college convenes quarterly meeting to discuss and decide on all academic issues, development in academic proficiency, curricular and co-curricular activities.
- □ It also convenes emergency meetings when necessary to resolve any urgent issue. It reviews recommendations for future growth of the institute.
- ☐ It oversees and supports wellbeing of students and staffs in the campus.

### 2. Phase Coordination Committees

- ☐ There are four phase coordination committees for each of MBBS and BDS courses
- □ Committees are responsible for guiding, monitoring and evaluation of the courses in compliance with the curriculum.
- It helps the Principal in all academic activities.

### 3. Faculty Development and Review Committee

- □ Conduct review meetings for quality improvement in educational program and professional development.
- □ Take lead in organizing continued medical education (CME), organize workshops for professional development, training on medication and skill upgrading.

### **Kumudini Hospital**

Rai Bahadur Ranada Prasad Shaha the founder of Kumudini welfare Trust established Kumudini Hospital with 750 beds in 1944. Presently the hospital is having a capacity 1050 beds, organized by departments and service units. The hospital complex consists of distinct building blocks for inpatient services, outpatient services, other administrative and support services. The facilities are contributing to treatment of patients and clinical teaching. The main hospital building is a three-storied structure of with a surface area of 131,300 sq ft and housing the following departments:

Disciplinary Council investigates and recommends necessary action to be taken for any act of indiscipline in the campus.




#### Academic Course: MBBS & BDS

The college offers 5 years MBBS Course and 5 years BDS Course as approved by Bangladesh Medical & Dental Council (BM & DC) leading to MBBS and BDS Degree of the University of Dhaka. The content and design of the course, subjects, lecture classes, tutorials and laboratory/ practical classes are approved by University of Dhaka in accordance with the curriculum laid by the Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council (BM & DC).

#### Course Curriculum: MBBS

Duration: 5 years Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery with additional one year

internship training.



#### **Examinations:**

- The MBBS degree requires 5 years of academic course followed by one year of internship in the affiliated hospital.
- Four Professional Examinations are conducted by the University of Dhaka.
- The Professional MBBS Examinations (1st, 2nd, 3rd & Final Professional) occur either on first week of May or November in each year as per new curriculum.
- Each subject under the course is the divided into certain number of items and cards examination. To appear at the professional examinations all students have to complete the assigned cards.
- Pass mark for University examination for written, oral and practical / clinical examinations is 60% individually.
- Student passing in the regular MBBS Examination will be eligible to obtain honors (85% marks) and place (up to 10th place) in order of merit.

#### **Local Examination:**

After completion of cards students in pre and para clinical subjects have to appear in term examinations periodically. Similarly, clinical students have to complete items followed by ward completion examinations. Finally, before placement for university professional examinations all students have to appear in pre-professional Examination in each phase.



#### **End-course Examination:**

The University of Dhaka conducts four professional examinations both for the 5 year MBBS course and 5 years BDS Course.

#### **Field Activities:**

The 3rd yr MBBS students have to complete one month COME (Community Oriented Medical Education) as follows:

RFST (Residential Field Site Training) for 10 days.

Day Visit (at least 8 visits to be performed) for 10 days.

Study Tour (to observe different national health related organizations) for 10 days.

### **University (Professional) Examination:**

- 10% marks of written examination of each paper for each subject is allocated for formative assessment.
- 20% marks are allocated for MCQ for each paper. There are separate answer scripts for MCQ examination.
- 70% marks are allocated for SAQ (Short Answer Question) in all subjects (except in Community Medicine) for each paper. Final professional OSPE examinations are conducted by University of Dhaka on the same date and time.

### Internship: MBBS

Internship training is an integral part of medical education and accredited by the Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council (BM&DC). After passing the final MBBS examination of the University of Dhaka, a graduate has to undergo one year internship in Kumudini Women's Medical College Hospital. After successful completion of internship all interns will be eligible to receive registration from BM&DC.

#### Course Curriculum: BDS



Duration: 5 years Bachelor of Dental of Surgery with additional one year internship training.

#### **Examinations**

- Four Professional Examinations are conducted by the University of Dhaka.
- The Professional BDS Examinations (1st to 4th) are held either on May or November of each year.
- Each subject under the yearly course is divided into certain number of card examinations. To appear at the professional examinations all students have to complete assigned cards in particular year.
- Pass mark for University examination for written, oral and practical / clinical examinations is 60% individually.
- Student passing in the regular BDS Examination will be eligible to obtain honors (85% marks) and place (up to 10th place) in order of merit.

### Internship: BDS

After passing the final Professional BDS examination of the University of Dhaka, a graduate

has to undergo one year internship in Kumudini Women's Medical College Hospital. Internship program is conducted as per Bangladesh Medical & Dental Council (BM & DC) prescribed rules. After successful completion internship interns will be eligible to receive registration from BM&DC.





#### Information for the students

#### **Eligibility for Admission:**

Candidates who have passed SSC & HSC examination in Science group with Physics, Chemistry and Biology from any recognized Board/University of Bangladesh with a combined grade point average of 9.00 shall be eligible for admission. But the grade average for each of the examinations must not be less than 3.50 and in HSC grade point in Biology must not be less than 3.50. Students having O level & A level qualifications should apply with certificate of equivalence issued from Director General of Health Service (DGHS). Students having passed SSC or equivalent examination 02 (two) sessions before, are not eligible to sit for the admission test. Married students are not eligible to apply for admission.

The criteria for eligibility and application modalities may vary with government admission policy in MBBS and BDS course for any particular session. Examination for admission is conducted by DGHS, Govt. of Bangladesh.

Documents to be submitted by the candidate

All enclosures must be attested by class 1 Gazetted officer.

- Photocopy of original/provisional SSC & HSC/ equivalent examination certificates.
- Photocopy of original/provisional SSC & HSC/ equivalent examination Marks sheets.
- Photocopy of original/provisional SSC & HSC/ equivalent examination testimonials.
- Certificate of sports/social work or any other extracurricular activities.
- Three copies of recent passport size photographs.

Original copies of the documents must be produced at the time of admission and all the original documents shall be retained by the college until graduation from the college. After primary selection and publication of merit list a waiting list will be declared. Students from waiting list will admitted as per vacancies according to waiting merit. Result of the final selection will be published in the specified notice board. Every applicant provisionally selected for admission shall be medically examined by a medical board and must be declared fit before admission.

## Charge and fees for admission

The selected candidate must pay necessary fees as determined by the management. Payment must he made within the specified date and time failing which claims for admission will be forfeited and the vacancies will be filled in by the next deserving candidate from the waiting list.



#### **Attendance rules**

Every student is required to attend all classes and clinical teaching in the college and hospital punctually. All students are required to maintain 100% attendance in lecture, practical and ward placement. Any student securing less than 100% attendance in any of the areas will not be eligible to appear at university examination. Failing which, the student will be required to attend a further course until the requirement is fulfilled.

#### **Accommodation rules**

The college is fully residential. All students admitted to this college must reside in the allotted students hostel .The Principal in special cases may allow any student to reside outside with their parents or guardian for a short duration. Any change of guardianship or changes of lodging by any student must be reported forthwith to the college authority. It is compulsory that students take their food in the hostel mess.

### **Disciplinary rules**

- Students must maintain discipline inside the complex.
- Rising of slogan, shouting, parading in procession are all strictly prohibited.
- Addiction to drug and alcohol abuse amounts to moral turpitude and such offenders are liable to expulsion from the college.
- Students are required to observe order and discipline strictly at all times in the college.
- Political activities are strictly prohibited.
- Students must behave properly with staff, employees of the college/hostel, acts of misbehavior are liable to disciplinary action.
- At the time of admission both the student and their respective guardian will have to sign a bond agreeing to abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
- Strict cleanliness is to be maintained all through the campus. Students are to refrain from plucking flowers and damaging fruit plants.
- Students are not to disturb or interfere in the affairs of other institutions within the complex.



### **Academic Standard/Standing**

Students are expected to maintain a consistently high standard in their academic work. Course evaluations will be made through regular items, card final examinations, periodic class test, quizzes, assignments and mid/end term examinations conducted by individual departments. The mid/end term tests shall include written (combinations of MCOs and short-questions), orals, practical OSPEs and OSCEs. The results shall be recorded in the students' progress report cards/logbook. No student shall be allowed to sit for the professional MBBS examination of the university without a minimum of 75% attendance in classes held, securing at least 60% marks in class assignments and periodic in course examinations thus demonstrating satisfactory attitude, behavior and conduct.

### **Extracurricular Activities:**

Students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities for the promotion and development of individual talents, physical and mental health. The college provides such

activities though Student Welfare Committee arranging week long literary and culture festival like staging of drama, debates, indoor and outdoor games. Moreover, humanitarian services such as blood donation, free clothes distribution amongst the distressed during natural calamities and financial donation affected to students/people for their treatment are encouraged.
